WELLAND HYDRO-ELECTRIC SYSTEM CORP.

Application for rates and other charges to be effective May 1, 2022

1 OVERVIEW

The Ontario Energy Board is approving changes to the rates that Welland Hydro-Electric System Corp. (Welland Hydro) charges to distribute electricity to its customers, effective May 1, 2022.

As a result of this Decision, there will be a monthly total bill increase of \$2.82 for a residential customer consuming 750 kWh, effective May 1, 2022. This change does not factor in applicable taxes or the Ontario Electricity Rebate.

2 CONTEXT AND PROCESS

Welland Hydro filed its application on November 1, 2021 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998 and in accordance with Chapter 3 of the OEB's *Filing Requirements for Incentive Rate-Setting Applications* (Filing Requirements). The application was based on the Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) option.

The Price Cap IR option is one of three incentive rate-setting mechanisms (IRM) approved by the OEB.¹ It involves the setting of rates through a cost of service application in the first year and mechanistic price cap adjustments which may be approved through IRM applications in each of the ensuing four adjustment years.

The OEB follows a standardized and streamlined process for hearing IRM applications filed under Price Cap IR. In each adjustment year of a Price Cap IR term, the OEB prepares a Rate Generator Model that includes, as a placeholder, information from the distributor's past proceedings and annual reporting requirements. A distributor will then review, complete, and include the model with its application, and may update the model during the proceeding to make any necessary corrections or to incorporate new rate-setting parameters as they become available.

Welland Hydro serves approximately 24,750 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in The City of Welland.

The application was supported by pre-filed written evidence and a completed Rate Generator Model and as required during the proceeding, Welland Hydro updated and clarified the evidence.

3 DECISION OUTLINE

Each of the following issues is addressed in this Decision, together with the OEB's findings.

- Annual Adjustment Mechanism
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Group 1 Deferral and Variance Accounts

Instructions for implementing Welland Hydro's new rates and charges are set out in the final section of this Decision.

This Decision does not address rates and charges approved by the OEB in prior proceedings, such as specific service charges² and loss factors, which are out of scope of an IRM proceeding and for which no further approvals are required to continue to include them on the distributor's Tariff of Rates and Charges.

4 ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

Welland Hydro has applied to change its rates, effective May 1, 2022, based on a mechanistic rate adjustment using the OEB-approved **inflation minus X-factor** formula applicable to IRM applications. The adjustment applies to distribution rates (fixed and variable) uniformly across all customer classes.³

The components of the Price Cap IR adjustment formula applicable to Welland Hydro are set out in the table below. Inserting these components into the formula results in a 3.30% increase to Welland Hydro's rates: 3.30% = 3.30% - (0.00% + 0.00%).

Table 4.1: Price Cap IR Adjustment Formula

An inflation factor of 3.30% applies to all IRM applications for the 2022 rate year.

On August 6, 2021, the OEB issued a Notice on its own motion to initiate a proceeding to consider the inflation factor to be used to set rates for electricity transmitters and electricity and natural gas distributors for the year 2022. The OEB issued its Decision and Order on November 18, 2021, establishing the 2022 inflation factor.

The X-factor is the sum of the productivity factor and the stretch factor. It is a productivity offset that varies among different groupings of distributors. Subtracting the X-factor from inflation ensures that rates decline in real, constant-dollar terms, providing distributors with a tangible incentive to improve efficiency or else experience declining

net income. The productivity component of the X-factor is based on industry conditions over a historical study period and applies to all IRM applications for the 2022 rate year. The stretch factor component of the X-factor is distributor specific. The OEB has established five stretch factor groupings, within a range from 0.00% to 0.60%. The stretch factor assigned to any particular distributor is based on the distributor's total cost performance as benchmarked against other distributors in Ontario. The stretch factor assigned to Welland Hydro is 0.00%, resulting in a rate adjustment of 3.30%.

Findings

Welland Hydro's request for a 3.30% rate adjustment is in accordance with the annually updated parameters set by the OEB. The adjustment is approved, and Welland Hydro's new rates shall be effective May 1, 2022.

5 RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES

Welland Hydro is transmission connected.

To recover its cost of transmission services, Welland Hydro requests approval to adjust the retail transmission service rates (RTSRs) that it charges its customers in accordance with the rates currently in effect.

Findings

Welland Hydro's proposed adjustment to its RTSRs is approved. The RTSRs were adjusted based on the current OEB-approved UTRs.7

UTRs are typically approved annually by the OEB. In the event that new UTRs take effect during Welland Hydro's 2022 rate year, any resulting differences (from the priorapproved UTRs) are to be captured in Retail Settlement Variance Accounts 1584 (Retail Transmission Network Charge) and 1586 (Retail Transmission Connection Charge).

6 GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNTS

In each year of an IRM term, the OEB will review a distributor's Group 1 deferral and variance accounts in order to determine whether those balances should be disposed. OEB policy states that Group 1 account balances should be disposed if they exceed, on a net basis (as a debit or credit), a pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh, unless a distributor justifies why balances should not be disposed. If the net balance does not exceed the threshold, a distributor may still request disposition.

The 2020 year-end net balance for Welland Hydro's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to April 30, 2022, is a credit of \$384,286, and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2020 calendar year. This amount represents a total credit claim of \$0.0011 per kWh, which exceeds the disposition threshold. Welland Hydro has requested disposition of this amount over a one-year period.

Included in the Group 1 accounts are certain variances related to costs that are paid for by a distributor's customers on different bases, depending on their classification. Namely, "Class A" customers, who participate in the Industrial Conservation Initiative, pay for Global Adjustment (GA) charges based on their contribution to the five highest Ontario demand peaks over a 12-month period. "Class B" customers pay for GA charges based on their monthly consumption totals, either as a standalone charge or embedded in the Regulated Price Plan (RPP). A similar mechanism applies to Class A and Class B customers for Capacity Based Recovery (CBR) charges. The balance in the GA variance account is attributable to non-RPP Class B customers and is disposed through a separate rate rider. The balance in the CBR Class B variance account is attributable to all Class B customers.

Welland Hydro had Class A customers during the period in which variances accumulated, however, the CBR Class B rate riders calculated rounded to zero at the fourth decimal place in one or more of the rate classes. In this event, the balance of the CBR Class B variance account is disposed along with Account 1580 – Wholesale Market Service Charge through the general Deferral and Variance Account rate rider.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Welland Hydro had customers transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances which are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying (or receiving credits) for their disposal.

Welland Hydro has proposed to allocate a portion of the GA balance to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels. ¹¹ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered (or refunded, as applicable), by way of 12 equal monthly installments.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements*.

The OEB approves the disposition of a credit balance of \$384,286 as of December 31, 2020, including interest projected to April 30, 2022 for Group 1 accounts on a final basis.

Table 6.1 identifies the principal and interest amounts, which the OEB approves for disposition.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and interest carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*. ¹² The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from May 1, 2022 to April 30, 2023.¹³

7 IMPLEMENTATION

This Decision is accompanied by a Rate Generator Model and a Tariff of Rates and Charges (Schedule A). The Rate Generator Model also incorporates the rates set out in Table 7.1.

Table 7.1: Regulatory Charges

Each of these rates is a component of the "Regulatory Charge" on a customer's bill, established annually by the OEB through a separate, generic order. The RRRP, WMS and CBR rates were set by the OEB on December 16, 2021.¹⁴

The Smart Metering Entity Charge is a component of the "Distribution Charge" on a customer's bill, established by the OEB through a separate order. The Smart Metering Entity Charge was set by the OEB on March 1, 2018.¹⁵

In the *Report of the Board: Review of Electricity Distribution Cost Allocation Policy*, ¹⁶ the OEB indicated that it will review the default province-wide microFIT charge annually to ensure it continues to reflect actual costs in accordance with the established methodology. On January 26, 2022, the OEB issued a letter advising electricity distributors that the microFIT charge shall remain at \$4.55 for the duration of the 2022 calendar year.

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GENERAL SERVICE 50 TO 4,999 KW SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

Commercial buildings are defined as buildings, which are used for purposes other than resident dwellings. Class A and Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. Customers who transitioned are to be charged or refunded their share of the variance disposed through customer specific billing adjustments. This rate rider is to be consistently applied for the entire period to the sunset date of the rate rider. In addition, this rate rider is applicable to all new non-RPP Class B customers.

Flat rate connects may include, but are not limited to, Traffic Lights, Street Lights, Bus Shelters, and Signs.
